Break Out Session Descriptions

a. Adaptive High Holidays with Rabbi Gilah

How do you feel about our expectation that High Holiday services will mostly be conducted online on Zoom? b. Long Range Visioning with Michael Linick (proposed incoming Long Range Planning Chair)
